



The York

Now a private residence, The York was a public house until recently. Tradition has it that Oliver Cromwell used the York as his base after Pembroke had fallen to him in 1648.



It has another interesting story. At the back of the York is a building called the Medieval Chapel (said to predate the Norman invasion and be the oldest building in Pembroke).

The first Wesleyans used it as a meeting house in the eighteenth century, and John Wesley himself was said to have preached here.

It was acquired by the York some time in the 19th century. Beer was brewed in the Chapel and the vat is still there.
